Abstract: The General Health Questionnaire (GHQ) was designed for the screening of non-psychotic psychiatric disorders. The GHQ is self-administered and comes in the following versions: the GHQ-60, for detailed assessment; the GHQ-30, scaled down for quick screening; the GHQ-28 with four scales -somatic symptoms, anxiety and insomnia, social dysfunction, severe depression, used for research purposes; and the GHQ-12, useful for survey work. The GHQ is self-administered. The GHQ-60 consists of 60 items and takes 6-8 minutes to complete; GHQ-30 consists of 30 items and the GHQ consists of 28 items; both take 3-4 minutes to complete; the GHQ-12 consists of 12 items and takes about 2 minutes to complete. Results are most accurate when the instrument is administered as part of a medical consultation. The General Health Questionnaire is widely applied as a measure of psychiatric illness in Great Britain.

Abstract: This 17-item instrument measures cognitions of hopelessness, a construct pertinent to depression and suicidal ideation.

Hopelessness is defined as negative expectations about oneself and the future. The HSC was model led after the Hopelessness Scale for Adults by Beck, Weissman, Lester, and Trexler (1974). It has a second grade reading comprehension level, making it useful for children 7 years and older. Scores of the HSC have been shown to be associated with severity of depression and self-esteem. Moreover, the well established correlation between depression and suicidal intent is minimized when hopelessness is statistically controlled, suggesting the HSC is an important measure to use when working with suicidal clients

Abstract: The Informed Consent with Substance Abusers Survey is a 27-item, multiple-choice survey that allows investigators to describe procedures and problems in studying drug and alcohol abusers. Areas covered include: participant coercion, including participant sources, payments, protection against coercion, and informed consent with minors; comprehension of consent, including assessment of competence at recruitment and assessment of comprehension; confidentiality, including use of a Federal Certificate of Confidentiality (FCC), confidentiality around imminent danger situations, follow-up tracking procedures, releases of study data, and access to data and participants' identities; incidence of and response to critical incidents, such as research participant drug or alcohol use or intoxication, presence of "reportable" illness, and imminent danger situations (e.g. suicidality, homicidality, and child abuse); and use of collaterals as data sources.

Abstract: The Infrequency-Psychopathology Scale uses 27 items from the Minnesota Multiphase Personality Inventory-2 which reflect severe psychotic symptoms, very unusual habits, highly amoral attitudes, identity confusion and a number of items on the Lie Scale (scale L). These items were endorsed by 20% or fewer of both male and female inpatients and normative samples. The scale may have use as an infrequent response indicator in populations such as outpatient mental health, substance abuse and certain forensic settings.
