It is one of the few available family satisfaction measures, and is easily completed in less than three minutes. The KFLS also has been used with Mexican-American families and Korean wives of American men.

Abstract: This youth version of the Life Stressors and Social Resources Inventory measures stable life stressors and social resources and changes in them over time. It is said to provide a comprehensive picture of the youth's current life context. The eight domains cover: physical health, home and money, relationships with parents, relationships with siblings, relationships with extended family, school, relationships with friends, relationship with boyfriend or girlfriend, negative life events. May be used with healthy youth, youth who are psychiatric or mental patients, youth who have mental problems or conduct disorders. May be used as a structured interview or a self-report inventory. Respondent rates each item, on frequency or occurrence, on a five point scale from "often" to "never". Internal consistency via Cronbach's alpha, ranges from .66 to .93 across subscales and sexes. Administration via interview requires between 45 and 90 minutes but allows the use of the inventory with youth who have a reading level below grade six.

Abstract: The Marijuana Effects Expectancy Questionnaire (MEEQ) is a 78-item questionnaire on the expected effects of marijuana use. Items are to be marked "agree" or "disagree." The questionnaire is designed to be completed by both marijuana users and non-users; each respondent is to complete the questionnaire according to his/her own personal thoughts, feelings and beliefs about "moderate amount" marijuana use, however he/she defines "moderate."
